Part 1: Definitions and additional information

Reinstatement allows a student who has been disqualified at CSUMB to become eligible for enrollment once again. Reinstatement refers only to the University. Individual programs may decline to allow a student to return to the program.

Readmission is similar to an original admission. All students must reapply by the application deadline via Cal State Apply to be able to return as a matriculated student. Apply for the next available term as early as possible, even if prior to the completion of the reinstatement process.

There are three levels of Reinstatement and readmission:

- 1. <u>First Disqualification</u>: Students may appeal immediately for reinstatement only (readmission is not required in this case) after the first academic or academic-administrative Disqualification. This petition must be completely filled out and submitted to the Office of Graduate Studies for processing. A program committee will make the final decision in concert with the appropriate Dean. Appeals deadlines must be met (see Office of Graduate Studies webpage for specific dates for each semester), even if the student does not intend to return to CUSMB that term. Students who do not attend the first term after reinstatement need to discuss the need for a Leave of Absence request after reinstatement; otherwise, the student may have to reapply to the program.
- 2. Second Disqualification: Students who are academically disqualified after reinstatement will not be considered for reinstatement until a year has elapsed since being disqualified. Students who intend to return after the year will need to reapply to the program prior to filing for reinstatement; however, students should expect to meet with the program coordinator prior to submitting an application for readmission. Student who are administrative-academically disqualified after a previous disqualification of any type are not eligible for reinstatement.
- 3. Third Disqualification: Student academically disqualified for a third time will not be reinstated.

Please note: Students wishing to change programs upon reinstatement must apply to the new program. Reinstatement does not guarantee admission to the new program.

Credential Students: Teaching credential students do not receive a degree form CSUMB and are subject to the regulations of the state legislature and licensing agency. As with graduate master's degree programs in the CSU, the overall GPA and candidacy GPA must be a 3.0 or above for completion. In the case of credentials, a recommendation from the university to the state credentialing agency would be withheld without the requisite GPA. Students who fail to achieve this level of scholastic success can be precluded by the program form repeating courses or taking other courses to raise the GPA and so are effectively permanently terminated from the university without the credential recommendation.


