

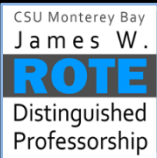


Fragile Places

Peter J. Auster, PhD - Research Professor Emeritus at the University of Connecticut and Senior Research Scientist at Mystic Aquarium. Dr. Auster is a marine ecologist whose work is focused broadly on the conservation and sustainable use of biological diversity in the ocean. Scuba, research submersibles, and remotely operated vehicles have been central for conducting much of his fieldwork, resulting in over 130 scholarly and technical publications. He serves on multiple panels and committees that are focused on marine resource management and conservation and has been involved in numerous outreach initiatives targeted at informing the public about marine conservation issues.



Peter is a Pew Fellow in Marine Conservation, a Fellow of The American Institute of Fishery Research Biologists, and has been a Mote Eminent Scholar in Fisheries Ecology at Florida State University. He has received multiple awards for his work including a NOAA Environmental Hero Award.
