Chris Lowe, PhD - Professor, California State University Long Beach. *Dr. Lowe* works with acoustic and satellite telemetry techniques to study the movement, behavior and physiology of sharks, rays and gamefishes.



Sal Jorgensen, PhD - Research Scientist, Monterey Bay Aquarium. Dr. Jorgensen oversees basic research on migratory patterns, feeding ecology and habitat use of adult great white sharks at the Farallon Islands, Point Reyes and Año Nuevo Island.



Barb Block, PhD - Professor, Stanford's Hopkins Marine Station. Dr. Block's research focuses on how large pelagic fishes utilize the open ocean environment - centering upon understanding the evolution of heat management strategies in tunas, billfishes, and sharks.
