Proposed Project Overview

Purpose: Expansion of current stadium programming and facilities to accommodate college athletic championship events, additional CSUMB activities, and additional professional teams and games

- Expansion of existing programming at the CSUMB Stadium by CSUMB and the Monterey Bay Football Club (MBFC)
- Construction and operation of two new locker room facilities, two new restroom buildings, and a gated event staging area

Environmental Review Process – Purpose & Requirements of CEQA

- Inform decision-making
- Identify ways to avoid or reduce environmental damage
- Prevent significant, avoidable damage to environment
- Public disclosure
- Public participation



Environmental Review Process- Purpose of EIR

- Disclose and evaluate the potentially significant environmental impacts
- Identify mitigation measures to lessen or avoid impacts
- Identify and evaluate reasonable alternatives that may lessen one or more potentially significant impacts



Notice of Preparation and Scoping – Purpose of Today's Meeting

- 30-day public comment period on NOP
- Solicit comments on the scope of the EIR analysis
- Comments should identify:
 - Environmental issues or concerns
 - Reasonable alternatives & mitigation measures
